 - o Red: Parent Contact
- I always try to have a conversation with student first but if I find the same misbehavior for several times, I will reach out to family to inform about misbehavior
 - Please not send any junk foods
 - Make sure your child not carries any age-inappropriate stuffs to school
- I really care my students a lot. If I see or find something, I always have a conversation with your child first and I am aware of it. I also reach out to school social worker and behavior specialist to create a safe learning environment and communicate your child.







