




CLASSROOM RULES

Respect Personal Belongings


Pay attention during lessons and avoid distracting others.

Kindergarten A Homework Expectations

Parents,

We are looking to make your child's first experience with school as fun and stress-free as possible. With being said, we would like to remind you of the purpose and expectations for your child's homework. Since the beginning of the year, every day from Monday through Thursday, your child has been given one page of 'Math' and 'Korean' worksheet each to work on.

Homework in Kindergarten serves three purposes:

- It reinforces what we are learning in school and provides extra practice for students who return home early or are staying in the after-school program.
- If allows you to see firsthand what types of skills we are working on and how your child is developing those skills.
- It prepares children by installing good study habits & routines early on.

Homework expectations:

- Students receive their homework folder (Red folder) on Mondays or first day of the week, due Fridays or last day of the week.
- On Fridays, if majority students' homework folders come back complete, students get extra indoor activity time.
- Parents would be expected to look at the homework inside the Red folder to check the completion of daily homework.
- Parents look at the communication paper inside the Blue folder to check teacher notes and homework info.
- Parents may email or write on communication sheet.

I recognize that children come to Kindergarten with quite a wide range of skills and abilities. Kindergarten homework assignments are not graded and are meant to be flexible. If you find assignments to be too difficult, feel free to let me know, then I can modify the assignments to meet your child's specific needs. If you find assignments to be too easy, then I can assign work that is more challenging. Similarly, if you prefer your child not to have any additional tasks at home, that is completely acceptable. Feel free to speak with at any point of you are on need of suggestions for modifying your child's homework.















Here are basic consonants and vowels combined characters, along with 10 words for each character. This will help the students to acquire a total of over 140 words:
